

# 2021 Program & Schedule Changes

In 2020 Camp Grizzly merged with Camp Easton into the temporary "Camp Gotham Bay" due to the COVID-19 Pandemic. We are excited to return to Grizzly this year and bring back what we learned last year to present an awesome program in 2021.

2020 and the COVID-19 Pandemic both presented new challenges and opportunities we never anticipated. Because of this, we tried some things we never would have otherwise, some of which worked great and some did not! But after all the smoke cleared, we ran a fun, safe, and unique Scouting program that most of our participants reviewed positively.

In 2020, we were one of few camps in the country to pioneer the new "Cohort" model and based on the Health Department recommendations we will again be using the Cohort model in 2021. This allows us to still offer camping programs while following regulations, as well as keep troops and patrols distanced and separated to prevent the spread of disease. There will be some alterations from last year, but the primary structure will be very similar.

# 2021 Updates & Changes

Cohort Model – Based on the advice of the Health Department, this model will return in 2021, although some adjustments will be made after lessons learned last year.

the Cohort model, most meals will be prepared in the kitchen, and delivered to the sites by our very own "ATV-Prime" Service! Some meals will need to be prepared in the campsite

#### **Pre-Camp Swim**

Tests – Allowing Swim Tests before camp smoothed the checkin process considerably and will continue to be allowed and encouraged.

#### **Hybrid Self-Paced**

program – In 2020, we went to a completely self-paced program supported by staff as opposed to the scheduled programs in the past. While this worked for many classes, we found it problematic with others. In 2021, we are working on a hybrid of the two systems to minimize exposure risk while maximizing class time and resources.



### **Activity Schedules**

There will be three types of activities and classes offered in 2021, Self-paced, Hybrid and Open Program.

#### Self-Paced:

These classes/activities are delivered in the campsite with all materials and equipment provided in pre-assembled kits. As the name suggests, the Scout always sets their own pace but camp staff familiar with each badge (or sometimes your own adult leaders) stand ready in the site to assist. Many badges fall in this category and this allows Scouts to complete as many or as few merit badges in camp as they are willing to put in the effort for.

#### Hybrid:

These classes/activities have some self-paced components and require hands-on instruction that cannot be delivered in the campsites, or require staff much more formally trained in specific skills to aid in the learning process. These areas include Shooting Sports, Aquatics, STEM and Trades Craft. Each campsite will move on a scheduled rotation to the areas where these badges are offered to have designated time with the trained staff supervising them. For those Scouts who are not working on badges in that area, they can either participate in open activities like free-shooting or swimming, or they can stay at the campsite and work on other projects.

#### **Open Programs:**

These activities are things that each troop or even individual Scouts/leaders can do at any time, so long as precautions are taken such as social distancing and wearing masks. These include using hiking trails, playing horseshoes, visiting the trading post and more.

# Aquatics Classes in 2021

In 2020, the aquatics programs were a challenge within the hybrid system, as they require very specialized staff doing hands on instruction to teach effectively. Spreading these staff across too many different classes simultaneously during waterfront times caused lower completion rates and frustration for both staff and participants.

In 2021, each Scout should select no more than 1 merit badge or activity in aquatics that they want to complete while they are at their waterfront rotation.

These will not be registered online like other classes but will instead be selected during the check-in process at camp. Each campsite will need to narrow down to no more than 3 classes or activities that their Scouts will focus on during their waterfront rotations. This will allow the staff to focus on quality instruction to no more than 3 classes simultaneously at any given time.



### **Rotation for Hybrid Classes**

Each troop will get at least 2 opportunities during their week to visit each hybrid area in camp. Once in the morning for 1 ½ hours, and once in the afternoon for 2 hours, for a total of 3 ½ hours of hands on instruction time with the staff in those areas during their week.

#### The areas are:

- Shooting Sports Archery, Rifle, Shotgun, Winchester Marksmanship Program, Free Shoot
- Aquatics Swimming, Canoeing, Rowing, Kayaking, Rank Requirements, Free Swim\*, Free Boating\*
- STEM Lodge Communication, Electricity, Forestry, Nature, Radio, Space Exploration
- Trades Craft Metalwork, Foundry, Welding, Plumbing
- Parade Grounds Horseshoes, Volleyball, Field Sports

<sup>\*</sup>All aquatics merit badges (see requirement #2 on each badge) and achievements specify that a Scout must complete the BSA Swim Test <u>before</u> doing any other requirements. If a Scout cannot complete either the "beginner" or "swimmer" swim test (See guide to safe Scouting) by the end of the first day of classes their schedule may be adjusted, and they may be moved to other classes outside of aquatics



### **Age/Size Appropriate Classes**

The Guide to Advancement states that "No council, committee, district, unit, or individual has the authority to add to, or subtract from, advancement requirements." (see Guide to Advancement p. 2) With that in mind, Camp Grizzly does not impose any age restrictions on our merit badge classes not already included in the badge itself.

We do; however, make note that younger, smaller, or less experienced Scouts may have difficulties with certain classes and activities. Such as holding up a shotgun for long periods of time, using the large gloves or helmets in Welding, or attempting Wilderness Survival before completing the knot and fire-building requirements leading up to Second Class.

While not required, we urge you to make note of these suggestions as you plan your visit to Camp Grizzly and create your daily schedule.

### **Camp Wide Events**

Most years, camp-wide events involving all the troops in camp are common; however, in 2021 while using the Cohort model, these will be somewhat limited, although we will do our best to ensure as many as possible are able to happen.

#### Vespers

(Monday Evening)

Monday evening after our campfire program, we hold a short, nondenominational worship service in the parade field area. All Scouts and leaders are invited to attend for an inspirational experience (socially distanced) in the Palouse river area.

#### **Campfire Programs**

(Monday Evenings)

We are currently working on a method for delivering a campfire program camp wide on Mondays while still socially distancing troops. This requires some technical modifications such as a sound system and some other logistics we are still working out. We hope to be able to offer this on Mondays to start off the week, and then encourage each troop to do their own in their sites on Fridays.

#### **Polar Bear Swim**

(Monday through Friday Mornings)

Wake up bright and early and come down to the waterfront at 6:30 am to take a short swim in the brisk morning water! Scouts and leaders who participate will receive a Polar Bear Swim patch to take home with them.

#### Flag Ceremonies

(Evenings after dinner)

Each troop will conduct their own flag ceremony at their campsite each morning. In the evening, there will be a camp-wide ceremony for the whole camp conducted by the staff in the Parade Field. Each troop will have designated locations to stand which will be socially distanced and allow us to be together while still being safe.



# Campfire Skit and Song Tips

Here are some things to think of as your Scouts prepare for their campfire:

- Keep it simple
- Keep it short (no more than 5 minutes)
- No jokes that insult or make fun of others
- Keep it Scouting appropriate
  - Practice ahead of time
  - Speak up and face the audience





#### Scoutmaster Dinner

(Thursday Evening)

In honor of those who volunteer and sacrifice so much for our youth in Scouting, every week we hold a special dinner just for the leaders who take their time to be with us in camp. Scoutmasters and other unit leaders get to have a specially prepared steak dinner and spend an evening with the camp management team.

#### **Family Night**

(Friday Evening)

Family members are invited to come join us Friday evening for dinner (or during any other evening programs but especially Friday night) and the closing campfires. Guests need to check in at the business office when they arrive in camp and undergo temperature and symptom screening.

Meal tickets for those who plan on joining the Scouts for dinner can be purchased at the trading post after arriving in camp.

#### **Movie Night**

(Wednesday Evening)

Every Wednesday night the staff enjoy a movie on the main parade grounds. Troops are welcome to join as an alternative option to hosting a campfire in their campsite.

#### **Honor Trail**

Honor Trail is a time-honored tradition at Camp Grizzly. This takes place on Tuesday night, and is an opportunity for Scouts to enjoy personal reflection time, as well as participate in a flag retirement ceremony.

Troops are led by Grizzly Staff on a short hike. At certain points on the Honor Trail, Scouts will learn about different aspects of Scouting, and the history of this our country. The event is an opportunity for Scouts and leaders to reflect on what it means, "To do my duty to God and my country."

#### **Laird Park**

Take a hike into Laird Park down the James E. Dewey Trail on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays for a jump off the dam into the swimming area, (pictured right) and handcrafted picnic lunches. A guaranteed good time!

Senior Patrol Leaders should sign up with the Program Director as soon as they are on campus.



#### Camp Wide Event Participation

All participation in camp wide events is voluntary. We encourage participation by both Scouts and leaders in as many of these events as possible, however it is not required.



### **Patrol Leader Responsibilities**

We believe that Patrol Leaders and Senior Patrol Leaders should lead their Scouts as much as possible. We offer several opportunities in camp for youth leaders to organize and lead their Scouts. The cohort model lends itself very well to a patrol centered camping experience and we encourage every unit to take full advantage of it.

Every morning after breakfast there will be a short meeting for Scoutmasters and Patrol Leaders with a member of the camp management to make sure that troops are aware of all the activities going on in camp and see if any issues or needs need to be addressed.

- Ranger Service Projects
- Evening Flag Ceremony Responsibilities
- Restroom Cleaning & Restocking

#### The Order of the Arrow

The Order of the Arrow (OA) recognizes Scouts and Scouters who best exemplify the Scout Oath and Law in their daily lives. OA service, activities, adventures, and training for youth and adults are models of quality leadership development and programming that enrich and help to extend Scouting to America's youth.

Each Wednesday at Camp Grizzly is Order of the Arrow Day. Any Scouts or Scouters involved with the OA are asked to wear their OA sash. Throughout the summer, there may be opportunities unique to adult and youth members of the Order of the Arrow.





#### "Go Ask Your SPL"

At Camp Grizzly we believe that youth should lead youth as much as possible. We encourage Patrol Leaders and Senior Patrol Leaders to take an active role in the planning of their troop activities while in camp.

We also encourage adults to drive this in camp <u>as much as is</u> reasonable by sending Scouts to their youth leadership when issues arise. Simply put, learn to say:
